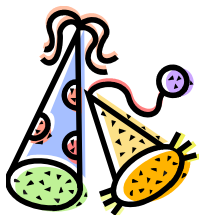
## Parish Ministry Opportunities

### Caroline Church’s Acolyte Guild

One of the most dedicated groups of young people we have at Caroline Church is the teenage boys and girls that make up our acolyte guild. Every week you see them properly attired in their distinctive red and white vestments and reverently ministering at the holy altar. The ministry of acolyte is rooted in holy scripture, “Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Never lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering persevere in prayer.” (Romans 9:12). Being a crucifer, acolyte or server is a ministry of presence and servanthood. Acolytes are those who feel called to assist the clergy and people of our parish in liturgies of this community gathered together to worship God. It is a privilege to be an acolyte and with that come several responsibilities. Acolytes walk in processions; carry candles, crosses, and banners; assist in preparing the altar for the Holy Eucharist, and teach the congregation through their actions about the norms and customs of liturgical practice. This year three graduating senior acolytes will go off to college. We are calling for all those currently in the fifth grade and older to join this dynamic group of young people ministering to God at the altar. Our dedicated Acolyte Director Mr. Duy Nguyen helps create a total experience for our acolytes that is focused yet fun. At the end of this and next month, we will have a couple of training sessions to help equip our young people to confidentially carry out their ministry, as they learn more about the church, its tradition, history and liturgy. Each apprentice acolyte will be paired with an experienced acolyte over the summer to acquire some on-the-job training. Several of our acolytes participated in the Acolyte Festival at the Cathedral of the Incarnation last month which was hosted by Bishop Provenzano. Our yearly Acolyte Recognition Day and party will take place in the fall. ## Join Us For the 7th Annual **Camp Caroline!**

### What is Camp Caroline?

Camp Caroline is an extension of our school year children's program. During Camp Caroline, your children will have the opportunity to learn more about the Christian faith through stories, arts and crafts, songs, and games.

### How does it Work?

Come to church during the summer and bring your children into church with you. Right before the sermon (about 20 minutes into the service), the Camp Caroline teachers will stand up in the aisle.

All children, ages 4 through fourth grade, will be invited to stand up and will be led out of the church into the Parish House where they will participate in a casual, stimulating, fun, hands on summer church program that follows the scripture being covered in church that day.

## A Stewardship Thought

*Jesus knew that the Father had put all things under His power, and that He had come from God and was returning to God; so He got up from the meal, took off His outer clothing, and wrapped a towel around His waist. After that He poured water into a basin and began to wash His disciples' feet, drying them with the towel that was wrapped around Him. John 13:3-5*

It was just a few weeks ago that we celebrated the institution of Our Lord's Supper and within that worship service we were reminded of the command to serve others that Jesus gave us. Those were the final few hours of what we call Holy Week. Before the night was over, Jesus would be - as He had warned - in the hands of angry men who did not rest until He had died.

And yet, there we find Jesus, in a borrowed room where He could spend His final hours with His friends and disciples. Judas - just hours from committing his heinous act - was there. So were the rest of the twelve. None of them was in touch with the importance of the hour. Only the Lord "knew that the time to leave this world" had come.

It was in these moments of the Passover meal that we read, "(Jesus) now showed them the full extent of His love." In a sense Jesus had been showing His love in escalating ways throughout the previous three years. His love had been demonstrated when He picked these men out of the rawness of their lives. He had seen in them qualities that no one else would have seen. He had stayed with them through their failures and betrayals. He had shown patience when they cowered in fear, embarrassed themselves in their selfishness, and reverted to the worst of human nature in arguing about who was the brightest and best. Love is the only word that describes the inclination that the Savior had toward this unruly group. And that night, there in that upper room, they had shown few signs that everything they learned had yet reached their hearts.

Our Lord did something that took them by complete surprise. He washed their feet! The Son of God (read these words slowly and carefully) stripped Himself of His clothes, took the basin and the towel, and set Himself to washing.

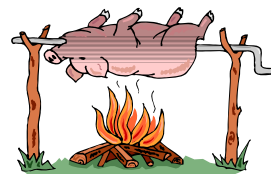
Aspiring generous giver, take note. What qualifies as an act as truly generous has relatively little to do with the amount of money one gives. Generous giving begins with the posture of total humility. Here we find the Incarnate Prince of Heaven, of whom the angels sing, who sits at the right hand of Almighty God as Lord of all Creation: on His knees before ordinary men, washing the dirt and grime of Jerusalem's pathways off their dust-encrusted feet. This picture must be riveted into our hearts. It shows us what we must become.

## Treasurer's Report

The sun is out! Memorial Day is one weekend away as I write this. Four months are in the books and, while we are a long way from a "balanced" budget, our spending remains on or under budget. On the income side, giving is catching up with 2010 levels. Month to month, we were as far as \$15,750 behind 2010 in the early months. With April closed, that gap has closed to slightly over \$2,500. As mentioned, the larger gap was based on an early 2010 stock gift, so narrowing that gap is especially good news. We welcome those larger generous gifts but the smaller weekly checks represent the backbone of your generosity and our income. Cumulatively, the weekly giving really adds up. Over the past five years, individual giving has thankfully gone up. With a flat budget for 2011, our goal is to bring in more from that weekly giving so that we may rely less on our investments. Please support our upcoming Fair, which generates the income needed to support much of our annual outreach to local charities. Please donate your time, talents and patronage on June 18!

In other articles in the *Carillon* you may be reading about plans for fencing, the parking lot and the Rookery property. One could logically ask how we can afford this work given our budget gap. The answer is rooted in the structure of our funds. Capital improvements like the fence and parking lot are paid from Building and Churchyard Funds. Our day to day operations are funded primarily from your giving. Shortages are covered by our Operating Fund reserves and from income/appreciation of the Remembrance Fund. If the income from those funds is not sufficient, we begin to draw against the principal of the Operating Fund reserves. While overall our endowment is recovering nicely, we continue to be concerned about the status of the Operating reserves. The Churchyard and Building Funds are in good shape and we certainly have a duty to keep the buildings and grounds of our historic church in good repair.

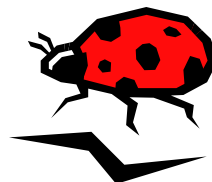
Investments continue to do well for the year, as reported last month. A more complete report will be issued at the midyear point. A move of our accounts has been completed so that we may continue to use Russell & Russell as our advisors. Mike and Sean recently became affiliated with UBS (Union Bank of Switzerland), one of the world's largest financial institutions with revenues of 47.5 billion in 2010. UBS' financial presence in the United States was greatly increased in 2000 with the acquisition of Paine Webber. We look forward to our continued relationship with Russell & Russell.

lift of the web site is in the works. I thank those group leaders who have sent me updates. Remember that while I can make the site more up to date in terms of design and ease of navigation, your input is critical to keep the content up to date. The new site will also bring a new and quicker way to post photos of recent events. The start of this aspect is actually underway and "gatekeeper" volunteers will assist me in maintaining the photo galleries. Look for the formal rollout during the first part of the summer. New articles and updates are always welcome.

## Camp DeWolfe News

Camp DeWolfe will be closed this summer for renovations. As the closest Episcopal Camp we are holding spaces in our camp this summer for those Camp DeWolfe campers from the Diocese of Long Island seeking, *for this year only*, a place for growth, renewal, and excitement. (And with our 700 acres, our 100 foot water-slide, our mile long private lake, our four water trampolines, our all-camp Olympics, and our stunning lakeside Chapel, things get very exciting!) Next year Long Island campers will be welcomed back to the superb and upgraded Camp DeWolfe!

Incarnation is America's oldest co-ed camp. Founded in 1886 by the Church of the Incarnation in Manhattan, we are governed by a board made up of clergy and laity from 24 churches in New York and Connecticut. Although not a Diocesan camp per se, we do celebrate communion Sunday at Chapel, conduct "Sharing Circles," and have Grace at meals. As a priest of 39 year's standing, (ordained in the Diocese of Long Island, from St. Peter's, Bay Shore). I try to make sure that our program is about "values" as well as fun. This year our theme is "Let Your Light Shine." Importantly, we are an ACA certified camp, which keeps the highest standard of excellence for all of our practices.

We offer one- month session for ages 7 to 13 from June 26th to July 23rd and two 2 week sessions: July 24 to August 6 and August 7 to August 20<sup>th</sup>. Our teenage camp, for 14-15 year olds, runs in a one month session, either June 26 to July 23<sup>rd</sup> or July 24<sup>th</sup> to August 20<sup>th</sup>.

The fee, with Episcopal discount for Camp DeWolfe campers only, is \$500 per week, or \$1,000 per 2 week session. This represents a 25% discount. We do have a very limited number of scholarships. Clergy children receive 1/2 off tuition. We provide bus transportation from New York, and if there are enough campers, from Garden City.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Severe storms and flooding have been battering the U.S. since April. Most recently, a massive tornado struck Joplin, Missouri, on May 22, killing at least 117 people. The storm damaged over 2,000 buildings, or as much as 30% of the city. Rescue crews are still working to locate survivors.

Episcopal Relief & Development is responding through the Episcopal Diocese of West Missouri to meet immediate needs with food, gas cards and temporary shelter, and is standing by to assist as the rescue phase shifts into recovery.

Thankfully, the entire congregation of St. Philip's, the town's sole Episcopal church, is safe. "A couple of our parishioners have lost homes and others have family members with injuries, but nothing life-threatening," said the Rev. Frank Sierra, rector.

We are also continuing to support the Episcopal Dioceses of East Carolina, North Carolina, Alabama and Atlanta, among others, in ministering to impacted people in the wake of storms and tornadoes in April and major flooding from the Mississippi River this month.

Your help is critical in providing temporary shelter, food assistance, basic household items, pastoral care and comfort for those in desperate need.
